## COVID-19 VACCINE FOR THOSE AGE 70 AND OVER

Phase 1B of the Covid-19 Vaccine has begun. If you are a senior who is 70yrs+, you are eligible now to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. The vaccine is *free and no insurance is required.* Louisiana Department of Health is working with select pharmacies across the state to administer the vaccine to people in this tier, including people 70+. If you are in this tier, you must call ahead and make an appointment with one of the pharmacies listed below. This is the beginning of the vaccine supply for this priority group, so not everyone will be able to make an appointment right away. We ask that you please be patient.
